Why do leaves change colors?

Yellow, orange and variations thereof always reside in the pigmentation of tree leaves, but they are overpowered by the abundance of green from the chlorophyll in the leaves. Come autumn, when the sun weakens and days grow shorter, the amount of chlorophyll in leaves diminishes, allowing the other pigments in the leaves to show through. Red and purple leaves are actually caused by the presence of sugars from sap that is trapped inside of the leaves.

Evergreen tress will not lose their leaves like deciduous trees. Their leaves, also called needles, are covered with a thick was. This wax protects the inner components of the needles, preventing them from freezing.
